Being both a parish councillor and the chair of Singleton Village Hall trust, I am keen to improve the provision of community space for all. I am mindful to equip the hall with renewable energy, we installed on the large roof of the hall over 112 solar panels that not only provides free electricity for the village hall but also generates additional income. I am happy to put to good use all my business acumen and try to run the Village Hall and as Chair of Finance, the Parish Council budget too - both seem to be running quite successfully using this strategy.

Singleton Village Hall is a great venue and used by many local groups and clubs. The diversity of these clubs is fantastic, and it offers something to do for everyone in our community. I teach Taekwondo twice a week which I really enjoy as it allows me to see individuals growing in confidence, increasing their ability, stamina and fitness.

Being Chair of Finance and as a Parish Councillor means we have to make some tough financial decisions, especially as funding is being cut both at the Borough Council level and County Council level, even from central Government, but as a Parish Council we are still able to raise funds via the Precept (the PC part of the Council Tax) in order to ensure that our community is made as best as we are able to by providing our community with the best assets as possible.

Our number one priority as a Parish Council is to always the community's best interest and value for money.
