THE THEFT OF INTERNET SHOPPING PARCELS & PACKAGES FROM OFF OF HOUSEHOLD DOORSTEPS

COURIER FRAUD.

Courier Fraud is where a package is delivered to your property and moments later a person calls saying the delivery was made in error. Only when a bill later arrives do people realise, they have been a victim of crime.

- 1. The theft of a parcel from a doorstep mainly in town areas where there is foot traffic by a "Chancer and opportunists" Sometimes the thief had no intention of committing the crime but there was a parcel and then it was gone!
- 2 Vans now followed no property is safe.

My work will need to address this risk in the coming months as we start to move towards Christmas.

We must encourage safe delivery arrangements.

Courier Fraud Alert

We have received several reports across the county, including, Maidstone, Sheerness, Gillingham, Longfield, Tunbridge Wells, Cranbrook, Rochester and Sevenoaks.

On four occasions, the criminals stated that they were a Sergeant Wiggins from Waterloo Police and that they had someone in custody with the intended victims bank card. They have also called impersonating Police at hammersmith Police Station.

They are asking the intended victims not to disconnect the call but to ring 999 whilst remaining on the line, to confirm that they were genuine.

These were all scams.

If you get a call like this and are not sure, then disconnect the call and ring 101 using another phone. If another phone is not available, then wait 5 minutes and ring a family member or friend to ensure the line has been disconnected before ringing 101.

Delivery Scams

How the scam works -

An unexpected parcel is delivered to the victim's door, which will normally contain a high value item such as a laptop or iPhone. Shortly after the delivery, a person wearing a unform from the same company will attend and state that the item was delivered in error and that they are there to take it back. However, it is a scam. The item would have been ordered in the persons name

without their knowledge and the criminals would have tracked the order to know when it was delivered and when to knock on the door to say it is all one big error. The totally unaware occupier will not know there has been a scam until they receive letters requesting payment for the item.

If you get an unexpected delivery that you have not ordered, then contact the company and agree with them which courier company will collect it and on what day they will attend.



Courier Fraud Alert

In the last two weeks we have seen reports of courier frauds across the county but particularly in,

Chatham, Dover, Tunbridge Wells, Tonbridge, Sevenoaks, Ashford and Rochester.

Remember, the police or your bank will never:

- · Ask for your bank details or PIN.
- Ask you to transfer or withdraw and handover sums of money.
- Send a courier to collect your bank cards, cash or PIN.
- Ask you to buy gold for them to collect to assist with an investigation.
- Additionally, your Bank will never call and ask that you transfer money to a safe account.

If you get any calls like these, they are a SCAM.

I must once again warn council of my grave concerns about car parking and access for emergency vehicles. An Ashford problem but certain areas of your parish this applies.










A fire engine needs a gap of at least 3.1m (10ft) to get through
