#### Chair's Report

Welcome to the second newsletter of 2018. It seems just a short while since Christmas but we are already in what's tuning out to be a chilly May.

Many of you will have seen the articles in the KE about the delay in the start of the widening of the A28. Talking to KCC Highways, they are as frustrated as the Parish Council about the delayed

start – I am not going to enter the debate over why this is happening, nor join any other speculation, but I am told that it will start as soon as possible as all is ready to go ahead. I will try to keep everyone informed about this issue.

After sharing a Caretaker Scheme with Kingsnorth over the last 3 years we have found that our caretaker, Peter, needs his own vehicle for our Parish as sharing one has begun to limit the work he is able to do, so we are about to order our own smaller van for Peter to use exclusively. Soon, you will start to see our own van out and about around the parish, so if you have a small problem that you think Peter can help with, please contact the Clerk.

Regulars who walk around Great Chart will have noticed work has started on replacing the play park in Singleton Road. We have been collecting funds over the last couple of years and will finance the rest of the cost from our reserves enabling us to have a new park now when it is needed and recoup this money over the next 4 years from our precept. The designs for the new park, which will be completed by about mid June, can be found on the Great Chart Playing Fields Facebook page. The wooden one being removed was installed between 25 & 30 years ago during the time that I was a PFA Trustee – I can say I actually remember it being put in and also painting the huge slide & swings that were there prior to this.

At the other end of the parish we are also about to replenish the sand at Cuckoo Park. We have taken notice of some Facebook comments and we will be making a few changes to make this park more secure and get the bunds cut more regularly too – it will be brilliant to have a parish with three fairly new parks with such a great variety of play equipment.

May is the only month we host two meetings and at the time of writing our Annual Community meeting is next week, so I am sure our Clerk will soon be publishing our annual report, including some reports from the many organisations in the parish. Look out for this as hopefully we may again circulate a copy to everyone.

# Ward Member—Great Chart with Singleton North SPRING UPDATE

There has been a good deal of disappointment that the improvements to the A28 are not taking place this spring. This is largely due to the Chilmington Green developers having a change of heart as to when they

would provide the financial bond to

KCC Highways to reimburse them for the cost of this work. The bond was originally planned be handed over in January/ February this year. Now it is not likely to be provided until 400 houses are built and occupied



which is allowable according to the terms of the planning consent. ABC is working to see if some compromise can be agreed but, in the meantime, we sadly contemplate the felling and emasculation of a number of mature trees.

I am working hard to prepare to become Mayor of Ashford on 17<sup>th</sup> May at a the Annual Council meeting. The Civic Service follows soon after on Sunday, 3<sup>rd</sup> June at 10.30am at St Mary's, Great Chart. The Rev Canon Tim Wilson will be my chaplain during the year and will conduct the service. Anyone in Great Chart or Singleton will be very welcome to attend – after all it is **your** parish church. The service will have a number of lively hymns and there will be a reception afterwards with refreshments in the village hall.

Recently I attended a reception at Guildhall in London with other Ashford people to witness the opening of a photographic exhibition entitled FIELDS OF BATTLE - LANDS OF PEACE displayed in the forecourt of Guildhall. This has excellent photos of the scenes of WW1 with text. We were invited as the Borough Council is one of the sponsors of this exhibition. After a month in London the exhibition is coming to the Memorial Gardens with an additional few panels describing Ashford at war. Following the Civic Service and Reception on the 3<sup>rd</sup> June, I will be opening the exhibition as Mayor. I do encourage everyone to view the exhibition during the month it is at the Memorial Gardens. It is really impressive.

#### **Great Chart and Singleton South Ward Councillor's Report**

Dear Residents,

Spring appears to be here and it's only six weeks late! In many aspects things that are good sometimes deserve a waiting period. Politics is much the same and on that note I have a number of successes to report in this edition of the Parish Council magazine.

Firstly the situation regarding foliage, litter and dilapidations has improved at the Singleton Centre complex. The management company has been spoken to by ABC and suffice to say has upped their game. This doesn't mean the area won't get my constant

attention going forward, because it will. But it is positive news.



Added to which the new knee rail I organised to have put in place on the road next to the car park has eliminated obstructive parking on this kerbside, which was a real hazard to the kids as they walked to school. And it has now been turfed underneath and the Parish Council's caretaker has stained it for me, so a big thank you there!

At Singleton Lake the first four FPN (Fixed Penalty Notices) have been given out to rogue fishermen who have been fishing in the wrong location and thus

causing grief to residents. These £100 fines will send a message to the "dark" community of individuals who have, for the last 5-10 years caused both physical and psychological harm to the residents of Singleton Lake. The PSPO (Public Space Protection Order) has done exactly what ABC hoped it would and reduce (significantly) ASB and Littering at the lake. With both down by approx. 70%.

But with the summer season approaching, and Kent Police's Rural Policing Team now fully geared and ready to help, the real test is yet still to come. Suffice to say the situation is far, far better than two years ago when I began to tackle the problem at Singleton Lake. Finally, the new TRO (Traffic Regulation Order) at the John Wesley school will come into effect in the next few months. Like the one outside Great Chart Primary School the hope is this will allow for a safer through-put of children and teachers in the mornings and afternoons and is really only stage one in the process of dealing with the traffic issues outside the schools.

#### Let's tidy up Great Chart and Singleton

Great Chart and Singleton is a beautiful area full of nature and greenery. Residents are invited to help us maintain the tidiness and cleanliness within our surroundings.

We are asking all residents to please refrain from disposing of any waste in car parks, alleyways and streets. Please think of

your neighbours and the overall presentation of the parish.

We are lucky to have a frequent waste disposal service, which





includes a service for garden waste. In addition, the waste disposal centre, close by in Brunswick Road, enables free disposal of larger items. Ashford Borough Council also provides a waste collection service for bulky items. The cost is £24 for four items. To reduce the cost, why not arrange a waste collection with a neighbour? Or if you have a small garden, share a brown bin with the neighbour?

With all these means of disposal, the dumping of waste in and around Great Chart and Singleton should not be necessary. Not only is it unsightly, but it can cause environmental issues.

Please help us create a clean and tidy environment to live in.

#### Report a Fault/ View planned KCC Works

If you see broken signs, overgrown vegetation, potholes, faulty street lights or traffic sign faults you can report it to Kent County Council following these three simple steps:

**Step 1:** Locate the fault on the interactive map. On the map you can also check and view faults that already have been reported.

**Step 2:** Describe the fault in detail. If possible, take a photograph of the fault and attach it to the report when prompted.

**Step 3:** Provide your contact details, phone number and email address and any other information relating to the fault you are reporting.

Kent County Council aims to repair most problems within 28 days, although some problems may take longer.

# HILLCREST ALLOTMENTS AWAITS THE START OF ITS FOURTH GROWING SEASON



Following a long, cold winter, the various members of the Barrow & Spade Brigade are now back at their plots on Hillcrest Allotments, with the season getting into full swing.

There have been moments, though, when the sheer quantity of rain falling from the sky almost prompted us to rip up our sheds and rebuild them as a gigantic ark, so wet did the

allotments become. On the positive side, all four of our 1,000-litre water containers are now full, so we will have plenty available to keep the crops well irrigated in the summer.

As per last year, our intention is to offer some surplus produce to local residents by hanging carrier bags full of runner beans, courgettes and so on from our fence (the one on the path down towards the wood) and you are more than welcome to take some. You'll find the taste is better than anything you can buy in the shops!

Hopefully, some local residents will also be inspired to take up a plot themselves. At the time of writing, we do have a few available at £22.50 (7m x 6m) or £32.50 (15m x 6m) annually. If you've never tried growing fruit and vegetables before, don't worry: help is at hand and lots of advice is available. Most current plot holders were originally total newbies.

We are also developing an environmental area in the far corner of the site, featuring a pond and lots of specialist areas for bugs, animals and birds, which we hope will become an added attraction for visiting groups of children in the near future. We already have an experienced coordinator in place, but if you would like to be a part of that project, do also get in touch.
