Singleton Environment Centre– Bee box

There are lots of events happening over the summer; our Clerk is running 'drop in' coffee mornings at Great Chart Village Hall – the date for the next (and final one this year) is 7th August 2019. Singleton Environment Centre held an Open Day on 6th July, a fun filled day for all. We have welcomed the first of 3 wild bee hives at the centre – this looks a bit like a space rocket and stands just inside the top gated entrance to the Community Woodland and has already attracted its own Queen and worker bees.

July will be another new step for the PC as our Clerk will have some help in the shape of Paula Cowperthwaite, who will be taking some of the strain from Ani whose has built her role up so much that she needs an assistant. Initially, Paula will be joining Ani for 10 hours each week but I am sure this will also grow in time – we wish her well and look forward to working together with them both.

Many of you will have seen the Great Chart Millennium sign back in place on top of the hill, having been removed in February because we noticed the bottom of the post was quite rotten. In order to prevent the strong winds at the time causing more damage, I asked for it to be taken down so it could be refurbished. Black Forge Arts from Wittersham (who made the Singleton sign), have done a brilliant job and the sign now looks, I think, even better than it did originally – it now shines in the sunlight! Suddenly when the guys were putting it back up we realised it was an auspicious day being the 75th anniversary of the D Day landings on 6th June, so quite a memorable date that will be recognised in some way.

Singleton East Ward Councillor's Report

Dear residents of Singleton East,

Firstly thank you to all of you who voted for me and thus returned me to this position as your Ward Member. It is a privilege and honour to serve you for another four years. Please contact me any time with any problems, that's what I am here for. Since the last newsletter there are a few new things to report.

Firstly, the strip of land adjacent to Great Chart primary school, which is owned by Persimmon Homes, and which has been cleared once but has now regrown, is to be tackled in a phased manner. The first phase was completed about 4 months ago by ABC's in house grounds maintenance team (Aspire) who removed the vegetation around the walk in entrance to the school, planted drought resistant plants, wood chipped the area, and put a knee rail in place to protect it. This area is already being maintained by Great Chart with Singleton Parish Council's caretaker.

Phase two will see the area of the strip from the above mentioned entrance moving up Hoxton Close refurbished. With hopefully all vegetation removed, turf laid and new spring and summer flowering trees planted. This area will thus be a lot more appealing to users of the school and the village hall.

Moving forward, the remainder of the strip going down Hoxton Close towards the road entrance to the school is to be maintained and kept clear from the path by Aspire.

The other achievement of note over the last few months is regarding Singleton Lake and the ongoing improvements to its vegetation and fishing architectures. Numerous fallen (or vandalised) trees have now been cleared by Aspire, and the work to renovate and improve the fishing swims, for all fishermen both disabled and able bodied, is due to commence soon. Later in the year I will meet with officers from ABC and the Parish Council to discuss methods of further improving the Lake Complex, as this process really is one of collaboration.

The PSPO (Public Space Protection Order) really has brought huge reductions in Anti Social Behaviour and Littering at the Lake, and by the time of reading this newsletter updated PSPO signs should be on the lamp posts. Alongside this will be the larger Information Signs, which will explain the layout of the lake in more detail to visitors as they arrive at this picturesque beauty spot.

Thank you for reading, and enjoy what is hopefully decent summer weather by the time this newsletter is delivered!

Hillcrest Allotment

Which of these two statements is true?

- ◇ The easiest thing in the world is to be a fruit and vegetable gardener.
- ◇ The most difficult thing in the world is to be a fruit and vegetable gardener.

The answer is they both are!

At Hillcrest Allotments, in Great Chart, we seem to either be struggling with a winter deluge or a spring drought. The former is good, because it allows us to fill up our water tanks, but is also bad because it can lead to weeks of waterlogging. The latter stops the weeds from growing, but also increases our need to water freshly sown crops.

Our soil – heavy clay – is about as nutrient rich as you can find, but it becomes wet in winter and dry in summer, so we have to incorporate lots of organic material to get the best out of it, so thank goodness for all the free horse manure in the field next door.

The result can be fantastic crops. Indeed, virtually anything seems to grow: potatoes, onions, tomatoes, sweet corn, runner beans, carrots, sweet potatoes, radishes, lettuce, beetroot, strawberries, raspberries, gooseberries, apples, pears, and so on. Our site attracts a variety of wild life, some of it good, some of it bad. There are lots of frogs to eat the slugs and snails, and ladybirds to lay waste to the aphids. The soil is teeming with worms and also insects that eat any decaying matter and help boost moisture retention to help the plants survive prolonged dry periods.

You would think weeds are the bane of our lives – and you could be right! However, dug up and placed in compost bins, within six to twelve months they produce the best compost in the world, which we spread back over the soil, making it easier to work and more productive than ever. There's blight in summer, too, requiring us to spray potatoes and tomatoes with copper mixture to ensure they don't die. It's worth doing, though, since they are delicious, particularly new potatoes that mature before blight strikes.

And there's always something odd that occurs, baffling everybody. Either yields increase for reasons that aren't immediately apparent, or something wipes out certain crops just days after they had appeared perfect. Thanks goodness for Internet gurus, advice columns, and those on the site with the knowledge needed to overcome these irritants.

Yet it is all worthwhile in the end. The crops we produce are far superior in taste to those that can be bought in even the best supermarkets. A sweet corn cob harvested just before it is cooked tastes like nothing many readers of this publication will ever have experienced, plus we can grow varieties at Hillcrest that you will never find commercially available, but they taste wonderful.

So, yes, it is hard work if you have an allotment, but the satisfaction you get from eating your own produce is an absolute joy. You meet like minded people and spend quality time outdoors, which more and more doctors agree is key to good mental health.

It is cheap too! We charge either £22.50 or £32.50 depending on the size of plot and that is for an entire year, which works out at less than 10 pence a day.

Beginners get lots of support and nobody minds if you eventually decide it isn't for you and move on. There are always more people wanting to grow their own.

Police Notice

It has come to the attention of Kent Police that there are a number of parking issues within the local area.

PARKING CLOSE TO A JUNCTION MAY:

Kent Police are working with the Local Authority and would like to remind drivers of the following:

It is an offence to cause a vehicle to remain on a road in such a position as to involve a danger of injury to other persons using the road, contrary to Section 22 of the Road Traffic Act 1988.

Penalty- 3 penalty points, £100 fine and/ or disqualification.

It is an offence to cause a motor vehicle to stand on a road so as to cause an unnecessary obstruction.

Penalty - £30 fixed penalty fine and potential vehicle seizure.

Kent Police and Ashford Borough Council would ask that you park considerably and consider the above.
