5.1. Cllr Barrett – Singleton East Ward Not present

5.2. Cllr Blanford – Weald Central Ward

Brompton Bikes are planning to build their new headquarters in Ashford but it needs to go through the correct planning process first. There may also be other companies looking to work on the wetlands around the proposed site.

The ABC portion only of the new council tax bill will increase £5 for the year for a Band D house.

Cllr Blanford is planning an official opening for the wooden horse, she will send more information shortly.

ABC is planning on sending £15K in aid to Poland for Ukrainian refugees, there is also a UK government initiative asking people to take refugees into their homes for 6 months.

5.3. Cllr Howard-Smith- Singleton West Ward

5.4. Cllr Shorter - Washford Ward

Cllr Shorter reported that things were quiet on a parish level.

The ABC budget was approved by cabinet, then agreed by full council last Thursday so this is now final.

Cllr Shorter spoke of the 1,500 jobs to be created by 2027 on the proposed Brompton site. The building itself will take up 20 acres of a 100 acre wetland site which will contribute towards the mitigation of the Stodmarsh issue.

Newtown railway works is progressing under due diligence. £14.4m of Levelling Up funding will be spent on the project in the next two years.

Business is starting to pick back up. Footprints Café is doing really well on Sunday carveries.

7.4. Amenities, Open Spaces and Environment Committee

The committee has tried to work with Kent Wildlife Trust for over a year but has made little progress. After speaking recently with the Bumblebee Conservation Trust, a walkabout has now been carried out to identify potential pollinator friendly sites.

Clearance of allotment land and the correction of a Public Right of Way has taken place and it will now be possible to provide further allotment pitches.

7.5. Staffing Committee

The application window for the youth worker was extended and two credible applications have been received, with two more expected.

8. Planning Applications for Consideration this Month

8.1. Planning application number 21/01315/CONA/AS

Land between the Pig and Whistle Farmhouse and Minden Cottage, Ashford Road, Great Chart, Kent, Discharge condition 22 (Ecological summary and mitigation plan)

This application has already been decided, therefore no discussion took place.

8.2. Planning application number <u>22/00285/AS</u>

Oaklands, Sandy Lane, Great Chart, Ashford, Kent, TN26 1JN Erection of building for use as a double garage with additional living accommodation (revision to 21/00340/AS) – **CIIr Y Barker**

A previous application for this site was refused and appealed. It has now been revised and resubmitted, However, it was felt that the objection given last time, that it should not become a separate residential dwelling in the future, still stands. It was discussed that the outline of the building may already have been built. The council resolved to object to the application as Condition 4 has not been included in the revised application as per the Parish Council's request.

8.3. Planning application number 22/00196/AS

Little Black Dog, The Street, Great Chart, Ashford, Kent, TN23 3AN. Proposed change to use of ground floor of building from former public house (Class A4) to form a single self contained flat (ground floor only), with off street parking and garden area. Minor alterations and replacement windows to enable new use. - Clir Y Barker

A former 3 bed house application was objected to as the parking was insufficient for a house. However, if two flats are put into the building then there will be issues using the two parking spaces if the one car gets blocked in by another, and it will also restrict access to the properties at the back of the property.

The council resolved to object to the application based on the lack of appropriate parking.

8.4. Planning application number <u>22/00234/AS</u>

4 Honeyfield, Ashford, Kent, TN23 4XP Proposed two storey side extension and single storey rear extension. – **Clir P Barker**

The plans are suitable, but parking appears to be an issue. There is a concrete pad potentially on ABC land providing parking for a car possibly associated with this dwelling. The land at the front of the dwelling is public road, not private land. It was suggested that Cllr Barrett calls the application in for proper investigation.

The council resolved to object to this application on the grounds of insufficient parking.

Technically expenditure is not officially approved in August as the full council does not meet. The proposed change will allow the committee to approve expenditure. As the full council was not quorate at the meeting due to declared interests, this will be deferred to the next meeting.

11. Crossing from Singleton estate on Chart Road to Ashford Community Woodland

KCC have approved the siting of signage alerting drivers to the possibility of people crossing. The work will be carried out in the next financial year.

12. Newsletter

After trying new printers and distributors, the work has now been returned to the original companies due to ongoing issues. It has been calculated that the cost of the newsletter for each household is 65p per issue.

It was agreed that the newsletter should continue to be printed, despite the increased costs, as it represents good value and is a cost-effective way of reaching all residents.

13. Speed Limit reduction from Bartlets Lane from its junction with Chilmington Green Road

The Parish Council objects to the proposed scheme to reduce the speed limit to 40mph. If the parish council maintains its objection, the proposal will need to go to the Joint Transportation Board where the decision to leave it at 60mph may be made. Cllr Shorter suggested contacting the relevant KCC member, Cllr Charlie Simkins, for his help to ensure a 20 mph speed limit is implemented.

The council resolved not to withdraw their objection to the speed limit reduction.

Appendix Two - Cllr Dirk Ross' Report

I wish to update on some news and happenings in my absence

- 1-I provided £2,000 grant to the Singleton Spaces (Singleton Environment Centre) to help with lost funding from covid to reduce losses on office bookings and revenue. So that the centre can manage costs across the whole offering of services.
- 2-I have provided £1,000 to scout group covering Singleton & Beaver wards to help with costs and to ensure those on lower incomes can still attend meetings as we suffer rise on a variety of cost centres.
- 3 awaiting an update on road markings, 30 mph speed issue even with signage. The upgrade is not functioning around the school, community hall to Askes Court. I want a rethink on the area to lower actual speed and make area safer for children and residents.
- 4 contacted the owner and management company about the state of the centre. Poor maintenance issues, missing bins, parking provision. Some investment and new shops have opened but visual elements still make the area look unkempt plus the medical centre.
